

Small Group Participant Guide

Luke 10:1-2 | Spiritual Teamwork

Key Scripture: He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send outworkers into his harvest." (Luke 10:2)

Objectives: Through your time exploring this passage, you will:

Review details of Jesus' words to the disciples being sent to the places He is going.

Explore the implications of His instructions.

Apply the principles shared and engage in the work of God's advancing Kingdom.

Conversation Starter: Famous Pairs

Name some well-known or famous couples (or pairs, or duos). What made them famous as a couple?

People will Respond to God (Luke 10:1-2)

What are some things you see today, either in the headlines or in your surroundings that might make you feel like this?

Where are you seeing God at work, drawing people to Jesus?

What are some indicators of spiritual preparation? What are some things that might be "open doors" for you to start a spiritual conversation with a friend, family member, co-worker, neighbor, or acquaintance?

According to this passage, who are we supposed to make disciples of?

What is it going to take to accomplish this assignment?

What excuses, reasons do you give for not participating in the work of the Gospel?

Read Acts 1:8. How do you personally identify with this Scripture?

Read 2 Tim. 4:5. How do you personally identify with this Scripture?

What biblical or practical examples do you have of outreach being accomplished in pairs?

Who could you partner with, and how can you partner?

What are the benefits of partnering? What are your apprehensions to partnering?

What is one "take-away" for you from this passage?
