May we continue to be a church that draws the world around us to find hope in Jesus our Savior as we worship and serve Him together.

A 60-YEAR LEGACY

In 1962, our church began with 30 people meeting in a home for worship. They soon called a pastor and after gathering in various locations, purchased five acres on McDonald Road in 1965 and built the first church campus. God blessed their ministry, and in 1974, they took a huge step of faith and purchased 20 acres in the far north region of Scottsdale at Miller and Shea. In January 1979, the first services were held at the new campus.

In these early years, God set the stage to do something great for His glory. He provided the godly leadership, land, and resources to build a campus, and He placed us in a one of the fastest growing cities in the nation. With a commitment to reach the community for Jesus, Scottsdale Bible Church flourished as we prioritized excellence in worship, strong Bible teaching, and service-based outreach.

The beginning of a vision being carried out today

Ten years ago, God gave us a vision to extend our ministry across the Valley by establishing new multisite campuses with a campus pastor, ministry for kids and adults, live worship, and video streaming of the Sunday teaching. We added SBC Cactus at 25th Steet and Cactus Road in 2012, and now in 2022, we have four physical campuses and a new online campus.

As we celebrate our 60th year as a church, we honor the foundation set by those who had the "assurance of things hoped for, and the conviction of things not seen" and found God faithful. It has been a journey of faith, and today our family continues to grow, witness changed lives, and build a legacy for the next generation as we are sent by God to the Valley and around the world.







A New Vision FOR THE VALLEY



In 2022, the SBC family embraced a faith-filled vision to bring hope and help to foster kids and families in our city, assist likeminded churches who need ministry support, and reach new neighborhoods. We believe God has uniquely prepared us for this season. When presented with the For the Valley vision, the people of SBC pledged nearly \$34M to join in this extraordinary movement of God. In February, we joined together in 60 days of Prayer for the Valley to seek God's blessing and direction in our 60th year as a church. We look forward to celebrating how God will use us as we *get out there* to serve the hurting, empower the Church, and reach the lost.

Foster Care

The foster care crisis in our state is staggering. More than **13,500 children** are in the Arizona foster care system and face devastating challenges. As a church, we felt called by God to do something with the abilities, influence and resources God entrusted to us. Many have already begun participating—from donating tangible resources, to volunteering, to supporting families who foster, or to becoming licensed as foster parents themselves.

This year we partnered with the non-profit **Firm Foundation Youth Home** to bring a foster home for girls under the SBC ministry umbrella. **Gigi's Cottage** currently houses nine girls, ages 7-17. An on-site staff team provides care for the girls, and SBC helps with financial and operational support for the home as well as facility improvements. This year, we added new AC units, security cameras, and updated paint and flooring. We are also serving the girls and staff through cards, birthday gifts, volunteer service, and spiritual care.

Church Partnerships

A second goal of **For the Valley** is to come alongside local churches in the Valley who share our mission and values. Many have built strong ministries in their communities but are at a critical point and unable to move forward without support. God is calling us to mobilize the resources, infrastructure, skills, and leadership He has gifted us with to help these churches.

This year, we established a dedicated team of staff and volunteer professionals to engage with the local church community. Team members are currently building relationships with pastors of

15 churches who have reached out to SBC. They are listening to each pastor's ministry vision, accessing needs, visiting their worship services, and planning ways to support them in meaningful ways. Using various criteria, our goal is to be both generous and wise as we discern greatest needs and help these passionate leaders fulfill their calling.

In November, we brought pastors and leaders from 14 Valley churches to SBC to help them connect with and learn from one another, as well as meet SBC staff and leaders. It is exciting to see how God is moving as we step out and come alongside His vision *For the Valley*, one church at a time!

Opening New SBC Campuses

Recognizing that many who attend one of our current campuses find it difficult to invite neighbors to a church that is a fair distance away, a third goal of **For the Valley** is to open campuses in communities where our people live. We are taking a strategic look at these neighborhoods and waiting on God to direct us to potential mergers, available buildings, and other opportunities.


This year, we continued to have dialogue with interested churches about future merger possibilities. Although we are not currently in a substantive discussion with any churches, we have tried to be helpful to all of them as they seek their next steps. We have a real estate team that is scouring the Valley for properties that could work to become SBC campuses. The first of our additional campuses, **SBC Fountain Hills**, is thriving with a full slate of ministry offerings taking place in two buildings in the city. We remain confident in God's timing while continuing to pursue leads as He presents them to us.

Each year of our 60-year history, we have celebrated Christmas in unique and meaningful ways with our community. We have also planned ways to give gifts to local families and children who are in need. This year, our events and outreach efforts were focused on furthering our For the Valley vision to help children in foster care by partnering with local ministry partners who serve them. Each campus collected gifts to present to the children at special Christmas parties in December.





SBC Fountain Hills donated **188** gifts and experiences for the girls living at **Gigi's Cottage**, the foster home for girls (ages 7-18) that SBC is supporting. This home environment offers respect, love and grace to girls who have often faced abuse or neglect. The girls and staff are invited to the SBC Fountain Hills Hometown Christmas Festival on December 11 and will receive their gifts on Christmas morning..







SBC North Ridge collected 330 gifts for foster children, families, and staff who are part of Royal Family Kids Camp, an organization providing Christian summer camp experiences and mentoring clubs for Arizona children (ages 7-11) who live in foster or group homes. They were invited to a Christmas party on December 3 at SBC North Ridge to enjoy dinner, experience a special celebration, and receive their gifts.

sBC Shea donated 1,117 gifts for foster youth who participate in the year-round programs with Hope and a Future, a local partner offering programs for foster youth such as camps, mentoring, life skills achievement, and college scholarships. The youth were invited to the Winter Block Party and a special Christmas party hosted by SBC at Hope and a Future on December 10.






2022 Teaching Series Timeline



HIGHLIGHTS OF 2022:

- Celebrated the 10-year anniversary of SBC Cactus in September.
- Opened the new SBC Cactus **Family Life Center** in February.
- Discovery Kids ministry grew from 75 kids in January to 140 on a Sunday now.
- YTH student ministry more than doubled, from 35 last year to more than 80 today.
- Launched several new ministries including **Forge** for men, **Family Nights**, **Grace Marriage** (with 30 couples), **Alpha** for adults and youth, a **young adults** group, a new **SuperKids** ministry for children with special needs, a **Growth Class**, and three new **Life Groups**.
- Launched a new Sunday night service.
- Hosted more than 1,200 people at their Fall **Trunk or Treat** outreach event.
- Donated four truckloads of items (bassinets, crib sheets, blankets) to bless new moms through **Thrive AZ** on Mother's Day.
- Hosted a November Turkey Drive for PV Community Food Bank.





- Spanish/Latino community at SBC Cactus grew to 54 meeting for Bible study and worship on Sundays.
- Hosted a Spring Festival for nearly 1,000
 Latinos in partnership with MentorKids
 at Palomino Park featuring an Easter egg hunt, inflatables, food, worship, and the gospel.
- Cooked and served a Cinco de Mayo lunch for the Cactus community.
- Continued a growing Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) in Spanish.
- Hosted a weeknight study, La Vida en Christo, that grew out of the Alpha class.
- Met weekly with local day laborers to hear their stories, share the Word, pray, and connect them with the Food Bank, medical clinics, immigration aid, and other resources.
- Helped the **Palomino Neighborhood Association**, **City of Phoenix**, and **Phoenix PD** paint over graffiti and do clean-up in the **Palomino Neighborhood**.





Our newest campus was a key part of the For the Valley vision to open campuses where our people live. SBC Fountain Hills opened on Palm Sunday, April 10, and was the result of a merger with North Chapel Bible, a church with a long history of ministry partnership with SBC.

HIGHLIGHTS TO CELEBRATE:

- Remodeled and revived a church campus built in 1974.
- Welcomed 637 on opening Sunday.
- Launched **Discovery Kids** in a new building and averaged **24** children each Sunday in a predominately retirement-focused community.
- Grew the new YTH ministry to 30 students each Sunday.
- Assembled a new staff team and celebrated their first VBS, first baptisms, first memorials, first membership classes, and more.
- Hosted a huge Bunk Bed Build with 115 volunteers building 88 beds.
- 50 volunteers served at the Fountain Hills Make a Difference Day to help clean and beautify the city and serve those in need with yard clean-up and house repairs.
- Began **Teacher Appreciations** and served staff meals at local Fountain Hills schools.
- Hosted tents at city-wide events to meet the neighbors and share Christ's love.





HIGHLIGHTS OF 2022:


- Invested in care for marriage and family relationships through pastoral counseling, classes, and groups.
- Launched Family Nights and first Sunday Family Worship Services to encourage families to interact with God's Word together.
- Reached 1,200 people from the community at the annual Fall Festival.
- Hosted regular Sunday morning events including BBQs and tailgate parties to build
- Hosted events for active Snowbirds, 55+, Singles, and widows communities.
- Launched a new **SuperKids** program for children with special needs.
- Furthered relationships with staff at **Desert Sun Academy** and were invited to serve teachers at Lone Mountain Elementary. Many staff visit our Café regularly, creating opportunities to interact.
- Participated in active outreach efforts including Feed My Starving Children and Church on Mondays (a team that assembles and provides hygiene kits and homemade blankets to the homeless and others).





SBC Shea hosted many special events in 2022:



- Offered excellent traditional worship with hymns, organ and piano, often accompanied by the Chapel Chorale, handbell choir, children's choir, adult choir, student musicians, and other quest musicians.
- Gathered weekly for a **Chapel Bible study** taught by Dr. Darryl DelHousaye.
- Hosted a Service of Praise and Thanksgiving in November.
- Streamed Sunday services to enfold online participants.





Worship Center

- Welcomed an average of 3,000 people in two Sunday services, and several thousand more via live stream.
- Initiated a new focus this year on creating more intentional community in a large space by having **35** section leaders get to know people in their areas.
- Hosted prayer and worship nights and revived the prayer walls to increase connection and prayer for one another.

Our online community continues to expand, and this year, the team set two key goals to help remove barriers to connecting with SBC:

- Prayer is a key focus for SBC Online. Typically, people reach out for prayer through a text chat-based interface, but many at home prefer a phone conversation. To meet this need, the team launched a volunteer-led prayer phone line to connect worshipers at home with volunteers serving from home for prayer.
- We also hosted an Online Connect and Serve Fair through Zoom after the Sunday services in August. People from all over the country joined a video chat to meet one another and learn about opportunities to serve and connect with the online community. We look forward to seeing how God will use our online campus to help people grow deeper in their walk with Christ and with one another.

"I grew up understanding Christianity, but when I was 18, I cut my ties. I still believed, but didn't see a need to accept Jesus. I lived selfishly, lied, and was a nasty, angry sinful person. God was still there talking to me, sending the knowledge, teachings, and people my way, but I wouldn't listen. I'm 27 now, and earlier this year, a friend invited me to Young Adults at SBC North Ridge. I thought it would be a silly endeavor, but I had nothing else going on and decided to take them up on the offer. That night I felt the same way I'd felt at a Christian camp when I was young. The pastor was preaching from the Bible, and it really resonated with what I was going through. I felt like I was having a one-on-one session. It gave me some food for thought and I kept coming back each week because I wanted to. It took a few months to reaccept Jesus because I felt guilty that I walked away for so long, but after self-reflection and words of encouragement from friends at church, I realized God will always forgive us even if we struggle and stray away. Since realizing that, my life has felt more whole and fulfilling. I still struggle like everyone else, but now I have Jesus to take this walk with." – Daniel Ingram

YTH Suns Event

In February, YTH took **420 students** (grades 7-12) to a Suns basketball game and then took over the entire arena for two hours post-game. More than **100 students** were brand new to SBC and got to hear a high school student share her testimony about how her life has been changed by Christ. Students got to play in a basketball tournament on the Suns court and play in a video game tournament projected on the Jumbotron!



1Mission Trip

In June, YTH took 67 7th-12th grade students to Rocky Point to build houses with 1Mission, a community development organization that gives people in poverty the chance to earn a house by serving in their community. The group assisted three families with the construction of their new homes.



Equipping the GLOBAL CHURCH

Defending the VULNERABLE

For six decades, SBC has sent missionaries and joined with partner agencies to reach the unreached, equip the global church and defend the vulnerable.

We began supporting our first global missionary in 1963 when Henry and Cecile Hawkins set sail for South Africa and began what has become a wonderful legacy of SBC's Global Outreach Ministry. From 1963 until today, we have grown to supporting 54 missionaries and 14 global organizations and are now partnering with national, indigenous leaders to help advance the gospel message to the ends of the earth.

Global travel continued to be precarious in 2022, impacting our short-term trips, but God is clearly still on the move around the world and not slowed down by any virus! On one trip to Budapest, a team joined 40,000 Hungarians at an outreach event celebrating the release of the ESV Bible in their language!

TANZANIA PROJECT

Since 2004, we've served two communities in Tanzania: Mairowa and Kondoa where we built two primary schools that provide Christian education in English. The sponsored students receive an excellent education, daily meals, and other support as they learn about Christ's love for them.

sponsored students in our two primary schools

5 67 sponsored students in secondary and vocational schools

34 students who started with us in kindergarten now attend **universities** in Tanzania. Only 4% of students in Tanzania graduate from high school, but almost 30% of our primary school graduates go on to university!

young women and men from Mairowa participated in the second year of our **internship program**. Designed by our **Global Counseling Ministry**, this program protects the girls from vulnerable situations at home and enables both the boys and girls to gain practical work experience in their chosen field, develop self-esteem, help their families with the stipend they receive, and grow in Christian character through **discipleship** and **mentorship**.

New Computer Lab: This year, through contributions from two sponsoring families, we constructed a computer lab specifically for technical training at our Kondoa school. **250** 4th through 7th graders will enjoy weekly computer training on **40 new laptops**. Students will learn how to use programming language to develop games and even teach robots how to move! Most of these students come from small homes with no electricity, running water, or flush toilets, much less TVs or smart phones, so this world of electronics is exciting and new to them!

A Tanzania Sponsorship Story

Haruni Gerald is among our new crop of graduated sponsored students in Tanzania. He comes from Mairowa and has seven siblings. His parents are very poor and could hardly afford to meet the family's basic needs. In 2006, Haruni entered our sponsorship program when we began a feeding program in the government primary school in Mairowa. The children there were so malnourished that we knew we couldn't build our school until we improved their health.

When we opened our school with three grades in 2008, Haruni was too old to attend. However, through sponsorship, he and other older students from the feeding program received support to attend the government school through seventh grade. Haruni graduated with top grades and went on to secondary school through sponsorship, but in secondary school, he struggled and his grades dropped. He became discouraged and almost gave up on his dream of graduating from secondary and vocational school so he could secure a job and support his family.

We did not give up on him. Haruni's sponsors sent him to Leguruki vocational school in 2019 to pursue a career in Electrical Engineering. He worked very hard in his studies and was noticed during his field study in a government electrical company called Taneseco. Because of his good character and work ethic, people loved him and wanted him to join their staff.

In 2021, Haruni graduated college and went back home to wait for his results. At home, life was very tough, often with no food. His younger sisters and brothers needed school items, but there was no way to support them. He longed to get a job so he could help. God is always faithful, and the company where Haruni had done field work offered him a job in February 2022. Now he is able to earn enough money to support his family and make sure his siblings have food and school supplies.



In his own words:

"I'm speechless. I don't have good words to express how grateful I am. All I want to say is, I thank God for my sponsorship opportunity. If not for this opportunity, I could not have secured this job and become a big supporter of my family. Recently, there has been a bad drought in my village. Cows are dying, and many are having a hard time feeding their family. Because I have a job, I can easily feed my family. It's now my desire to help other people who are now suffering just as I was before. I plan to go for further education so I will earn more income and support others. May God bless you all and my sponsor for changing my life."
