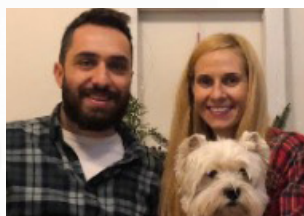

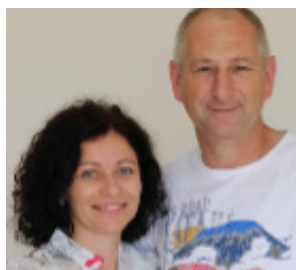

Steven is serving with CRU in a sensitive area of Turkey.



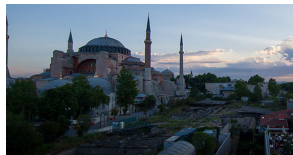

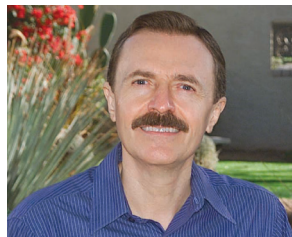

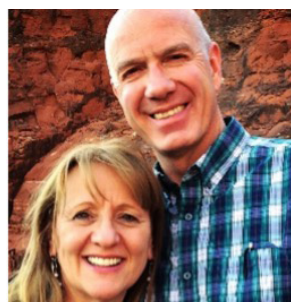
